Panas CF Viola Strings Together 3 Game-Saving Catches; **Panthers Snag 1st NYS Region 1 Title, Advance to Final 4**

Walter Panas CF Brianna Viola (above) bailed the Panthers out of significant trouble with three game-saving catches in Panas' 2-0 win over Section 9 champion Minisink Valley in last Saturday's NYSPHSAA Region 1 Class A championship at Rhinebeck High School where Viola's leaping, third-inning grab erased a three-run home run off the bat of Minisink Valley pitcher Emma Brennan and allowed the celebratory Panthers to live another day. For the first time in school history, Panas advanced to this Saturday's NYS Final 4 challenge against Section 6 champion Williamsville East, the No.1 team in the state, at 9 a.m.at Moreau State Park in South Glens Falls. If No.8 Panas wins that game, it will play in the state final at 1:30 p.m. against the Sayville/Ballston Spa winner.

Panas Knocks off Minisink Valley, Zeroes in on NYS Title Panthers are Final 4 Bound After 2-0 Region 1 Championship Triumph

The Walter Panas varsity softball team was on a major roll, reeling off four consecutive victories to win the Section 1 Class A championship.

The Panthers' mojo was bursting at the seams entering the New York State Public High School Athletic Association Softball Championships. However, Panas had the good fortune, if you want to view it that way, of earning a bye into the regional final.

So, instead of getting right back on the field and playing, Panas received a weeklong break. This is the last thing a team on a roll wants, to have its momentum disrupted. No problem though, for Panas.

Panas P Olivia Bordenaro tossed a sixhitter and centerfielder Bri Viola made the defensive play of the year, fueling Panas to a 2-0 win over Section 9 champion, Minisink Valley, in a Class A regional final at Rhinebeck High School.

Panas advances to the first state final four in program history. The Panthers will play Williamsville North (Section 6) in one semifinal, Friday, 9 a.m., at Moreau Recreational Park in Fort Edward. The other semifinal will be Sayville (Section 11)-Ballston Spa (Section 2), also Friday, 9 a.m. The winners play for the state title, Saturday, 1:30 p.m.

Panas Coach Dale Chappelle gave his team Monday and Tuesday off, returning to practice Wednesday.

"We really worked at practice on hitting for contact and not for home runs," said senior Gianna Servedio, who will attend Hunter College in the fall, major in nursing and play softball. "We found that before a big game, we would do a huge team bonding and I feel like that really brought us closer together. We also scrimmaged John Jay East Fishkill and competed closely with the great team they have there."

John Jay-East Fishkill was the Section 1 Class AA champion.

Minisink Valley earned a berth in the regional final with a 6-5 win over Vestal, but the Section 9 champion could not solve

on a SS Julia Petrovich's sacrifice fly, led 1-0 in the third when Viola made the outstanding play, worthy of ESPN's top plays of the day.

"Minisink had runners on first and second with one out," Chappelle explained. "The ball was hit deep, to dead center. I thought it was out. She got the glove up at the last second and backed right into the mesh fence. Next thing I saw was her feet up in the air and I was worried she might be hurt, but she held on and was ok.

"If Viola doesn't catch that ball, its a very different game. I'm so happy for her because she is one of the best human beings I know."

Viola provided Panas with an instant energy boost. "After that catch our energy level as a team shot through the roof," said senior Isabella Feraca, who will attend the University of Rochester in the fall, major in chemical engineering or optics, and play softball. "Not only were we all excited for her, deep down we all knew that catch saved our historic run, considering we haven't won a sectional title since 1983. I think we all realized we had to keep fighting."

The one run held up until the sixth inning when Panas added an insurance marker as Servedio had a lead-off single and scored on a wild pitch.

Bordenaro made the run look huge. Even though she only

had two strikeouts, her and catcher Kat Reynoso were in sync.

"What made Olivia effective was that she knew the defense behind her has her back," Servedio said. "Also Olivia and Kat have great chemistry, and combined with their skills

and softball intelligence they can make great things happen."

As the game progressed and even though it was only a one-run game through five innings, Feraca realized Minisink's impatience setting in.

"After we scored in the first inning, I

The Section 1 Softball Coaches Association held its annual all-section dinner and many players from the Putnam Examiner coverage area were recognized for their excellent seasons.

LAKELAND, which went 22-1 this season and were the Section 1 Class A runner-up, had three All-Section recipients in senior Claire Fon, junior Krystal Badillo and freshman Shannon Scotto. Coach Steve Fallo won the League II-C Coach of the Year. The Adelphi-bound Fon was also named the League II-C Most Valuable Player and Pitcher of the Year. She was also the Skip Walsh scholarship winner (Walsh was the long-time Eastchester softball coach). a spring it's been for the Lakeland Central School District, including Lakeland and Walter Panas. The district pulled in a pair of Section 1 titles and had four teams challenging for a title in their respective sectional championships, including two softball teams in NYS Class A semifinalists Walter

Panas and sectional runner-up Lakeland; the two-time reigning Section 1 Class A champion Lakeland baseball team, which was eliminated from the state tournament last Thursday in a 5-4 loss to Section 4's Maine Endwell; and the Section 1 Class A runner-up Lakeland/Panas boys' lax team, which fell in the finals to two-time defending champion Mamaroneck.

Coach Dale Chappelle's Panas softball team has made an historic run to the NYSPHSAA Class A Final 4 after last Saturday's 2-0 win over Section 9 champion Minisink Valley at Rhinebeck High School where the state-ranked (No.8) Panthers (16-9) played sparkling, web-gem defense, scored early and tacked on a late insurance run in support of Panas sophomore P Olivia Bordenero.

So, this No.10 seed from Section 1 playing with house money the whole time - is on the verge of challenging for a NYS title this weekend at Moreau Park in South Glens Falls. Stunning!

"Some people will tell you we're really not a 10-seed given the teams we've faced in Section 1 and the league we play in," Chappelle said. "You don't get any better at anything unless you have to fight up hill, so I like the underdog role. That was

"I can't tell you how good I feel for that kid," Chappelle said. "All three of our outfielders are seniors

and each one of them had a big play today. They may not get a lot of the press that some of the others do, but they came up big when we needed them."

None bigger than Viola. Momentum took her grab at the mesh over the fence, but she had both feet planted firmly on the ground at the time of the catch, taking a three-run homer off the board.

"That was amazing, I still don't believe it happened," Viola said. "I'm like speechless. I just followed the ball like I usually do and don't pay much attention to the fence, which is why I flipped over it."

LAKELAND baseball is another club we fully expect to recover from its 5-4 loss to Maine-Endwell in the opening round of the NYS Class A tournament. Coach

Bill Casey's Hornets were ranked No.1 in the state, but lost on a wild pitch by junior Joe Vetrano, who will make it his mission to get back to states in 2020 after leading them to the state finals in 2018. Regardless of the loss to M-E, it's been another historic campaign for fivetime sectional champ Lakeland, which repeated for the first time ever in 2019. As I hear it, there were lessons to be learned from the loss Maine-Endwell: to Lakeland discovered that not everybody

If you saw former MAHOPAC ace Brendan White pitch for the Indians back in 2016, you were lucky enough to see what a pit bull looks like in a human body. White wasn't overly powerful on the mound, had better-than-average stuff but mostly gutted his way to a 1.30 career ERA over two varsity seasons. He whiffed 40 batters in 48 innings at Mahopac and found his way to Siena where the first team All-MAAC selection fired three brilliant campaigns before being selected by the

season, White ranks third all-time at Siena in strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.91), fourth in games started (44), tied for fourth in strikeouts (192) and tied for 10th in complete games (12). He amassed 12 victories over his three seasons while posting an overall ERA of 3.93.

But it was his 2019 season that caught the eye of MLB scouts, which were drawn in by the following: White ranks tied for second nationally with six complete games, and finished second in the MAAC in ERA (3.00), tied for third in strikeouts (93), and fourth in innings pitched (90.0). The 93 K's is a Siena single-season record.

"It's surreal, that's really all I can say about it," White said of being drafted. "It's definitely tough to describe the feelings from it all. Just surreal and I'm at a loss of words."

Former Mahopac baseball Coach Chris Miller called it, "An amazing accomplishment, I couldn't be happier for him."

So, we asked Miller: To be totally honest, when he

left Mahopac, did you see a prospective MLB draft pick or just a bulldog pitcher who would have a fine college career and then move on in life?

"In all honesty, I didn't think he was MLB material at that time," Miller said. "He was a definite bulldog. He was awesome in high school, absolutely dominant in every outing his senior year. I didn't think he threw hard enough for MLB, but three years later with an unbelievable work ethic, he raised his velocity while keeping his accuracy and breaking stuff.

"All of this couldn't happen to a better kid," Miller added. "He did it the Mahopac way, just like C.J. Riefenhauser (drafted in the 20th round in 2010 out of Chipola Junior College) did. No matter what happened, I knew he would be successful because of that work ethic."


Lo' and behold, the coach was right...
