Local Teams Begin Preparation for Abbreviated 12-Game Season

It looks like it's finally here: Go time! As of Monday's Examiner deadline, some of the hurdles and hoops had been jumped over and through to get a Section 1 girls' basketball season underway. NYS Gov. Andrew Cuomo and local county executives agreed to permit high-risks sports to #LetThemPlay despite the potentially harmful effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. However, student athletes, coaches and superintendents were still awaiting clearance from department of health officials throughout NYS, including the four counties comprising Section 1; Westchester, Putnam, Dutchess and Rockland.

School superintendents and athletic directors are awaiting final word, concerned that potentially unrealistic modifications and mandates that could complicate the

hall is back!

We reached out to every girls' hoops coach in the Examiner region from White Plains to the Dutchess County border for team-based information, and discovered that while most programs are excited to begin the 2021 season, there is so much work to do before we see something resembling what we're used to. Many players won't be in "game shape" when the season starts, they won't be as sharp in their sets, nor will they be completely familiar with coaching systems, especially rookies. So, it could be a few weeks before we see teams in "game shape', playing with tempo and continuity, and before we know it the season will be over if it ever starts. Strap up, buckle in and accept that it is what it is.


