Sports Boys Soccer Notebook Yorktown Pulls Away from Lakeland as State-Ranked Powers Clash

Everyone we asked prior to the start of the 2022 campaign suggested YORKTOWN was the team to beat in Class A this season, and Coach Zoran Milojevic's undefeated Huskers (6-0) did nothing to dispel that notion last week after they zipped past Rye, 4-1, Nanuet, 2-1, and then blanked LAKELAND, 2-0, Saturday afternoon at The Murph.

"I loved that Lakeland came ready to play rather than staying back and defend," Milojevic said. We had scouted them very well and were waiting for them to crack. It was a tremendously tough week where we played four very competitive matches. It all comes down to hours, days and months we used to prepare for this grueling season. Defense stood tall today, but we made the difference in the midfield by winning 50-50's and having more possession. Very clean game and congrats to Lakeland for playing it fair."

Against Nanuet, Yorktown's combination of Nick Varela (2G) and Matt Pozo (2A) were in sync, the duo building a 2-0 halftime edge that goalies JP Frucco (2 saves in the first half) and Jason Douglas (1 save on two shots on goal in the second half) preserved, but the Huskers allowed their first two goals against all season.

'Rye scored on us first," Milojevic said. "We were playing on a very uneven grass field. I was rotating a lot of players and we were a bit exposed in the second half. Nanuet used it to score on us."

In the early going, it looks like stateranked (No.3) Yorktown (7-0), and Tappan Zee (5-0), which just blanked defending NYS champion SOMERS, 2-0, as the upper crust of Class A. The next Class A tier would include state-ranked (No.19) LAKELAND (4-1-1) – which will have faced Eastchester,

Somers, Yorktown Establishing Early Dominance on Class A Circuit

SOMERS had a successful 2021 season, however, it came to a premature conclusion in the quarterfinal round of the Section 1 Class A Girls' Soccer Championship to Pearl River in the fourth overtime.

It was a crushing way to end a team's season, especially for Somers' nine seniors. Despite the loss, current senior and captain Victoria Olsen said the team came away with many positives that they had planned to build on for the 2022 season.

"We learned to never give up, consistency, and the importance of leadership," said Olsen, a three-year varsity starter. "We had some rough patches during the 2021 season but we persevered and continued to work hard. These are things that we have taken from last year and are using this year to go

even further."

Somers has once again established itself as a prime contender for the Section 1 Class A soccer title as the Tuskers are currently 5-0, outscoring their opponents, 30-3.

Not many programs can withstand the graduation of nine seniors, including five starters, and still remain a sectional power. Somers has continued its high-caliber play based on the returning nucleus, highlighted by Olsen along with classmates Ava Giudice, Lindsay Gill, Maddie Lyle, Natalie Phelan, Alexis Aakjar and goalie Hannah Maguire.

Somers also boasts two of the top sophomores on Section 1 in Julia Arbelaez, who has a five-goal game this season, and Tiana Righetti, both returning starters. Once this core was combined with the varsity newcomers in preseason, Somers was in step and ready to go.

"In preseason, I saw a lot of new talent that meshed well with the talent we already had," said Olsen, who plays midfield and defense. "I easily was able to envision all the players playing well together and creating a strong team connection."

Somers could not have asked for a better start with five wins, especially its ability to score. Olsen credits teamwork, on and off the field, for the success to date.

"I have been really impressed by the way our team helps each other," Olsen said. "Every person in every position helps everyone on the field which makes the playing dynamic a lot easier and smoother. I think we have a tight-knit friendship and bond that makes us effective offensively and defensively. All of us are good friends on and off the field and I think because of that we can easily play together and have trust in all aspects of the field."

As Somers prepares for the difficult part of its schedule, it does so with confidence. However, the Tuskers also understand they need to focus on improving daily.

"The past few wins have allowed us to gain confidence and see what we need to work on to make our team even better," Olsen explained. "The upcoming games are continued on next page

Pleasantville, Somers, Carmel Keep on Keepin' On

In what could only be described as an otherwise uneventful football weekend along the Section 1 circuit, the three reigning Section 1 champions of the Examiner area – Class AA Carmel, Class A Somers and Class B Pleasantville – continued to do what they do better than the rest of Section 1: WIN!

CLASS B

PLEASANTVILLE QB Aidan Picart hit on an efficient 10 of 13 passes for 144 yards and three touchdowns — two to his brother, Daniel — plus a 17-yard touchdown pass to Louis Sdao. Daniel Picart rushed for 164 yards and the NYS Class B runner-up Panthers (2-0) cleared a major hurdle by knocking off last year's sectional finalists.

"I guess it took a week to get settled in," first team All-NYS player Daniel Picart said, "and now we're feeling more comfortable doing what me and Aidan are supposed to be doing and trusting each other more. Also, credit to our linemen, who played out of their minds on pass blocking and run plays making huge gaps for me to run behind."

Chad Saragganonda, Brian McPhee and Owen Mooney each had a sack for a stingy defense that has allowed just nine points in two games for a Pleasantville outfit that has the look of a repeat offender as it enters Week 3 against host Bronxville (1-2).

CLASS A

SOMERS was who we thought they were in the second half of its 41-7 rout of host Eastchester Saturday when Tusker QB Matt Fitzsimons took over in the second half, hitting on 11 of 14 passes for 173 yards and a touchdown through the air while rushing two TD's. Speedy Somers RB Ravi Dass Jr. needed just four touches to amass 114 yards and two scores for the Tuskers (2-0).

"I think we are starting to click a little more and more as the days go on," All-NYS Tusker OL/DL Jake Polito said. "Definitely some positives to take away from the game, but I don't think we have scratched the

surface yet. We gotta take the weeks as they come and keep up our practice habits to keep improving. What separates Somers football is that enough is never enough."

YORKTOWN was within inches of pulling off a massive upset before falling at Rye, 13-12, when the Garnets (3-0) erased a 12-0 deficit late in the third quarter. Husker QB Caden Gonzalez hit on 6 of 18 passes for 118 yards and a TD strike to Thomas Costello (3 catches, 58 yards). Conor Duncan had eight tackles, two sacks and a safety on defense while Jack Freone (9 tackles) and Ryan Vogel (8 tackles) each had big defensive days for the Huskers (2-1).

"The result wasn't what we wanted but this team is going to give everyone their best shot," Husker Coach Pantelis Ypsilantis said. "Yorktown will not back down from anyone and will always grind. Sometimes we will come up short, but we are going to empty the tank and give it everything we have week in and week out. These guys are

fighters and from a coaches perspective, you can always work with that. I couldn't be prouder of their effort.

FOX LANE's Max Travis tossed a careerhigh 231 yards and two touchdowns on 16 carries in the Foxes' 21-14 win over host Nyack. The junior also snagged a 62-yard touchdown pass from QB John Czernyk, who struck gold on 7 of 10 for 115 yards in his first varsity game for the Foxes (1-2).

BREWSTER (0-2) had an eye-opening 44-20 loss to Harrison (1-2), which did not bode well for Coach Ed Mulvihille's Bears.

"Harrison had good size and they pushed us around up front," the coach admitted. "They are a very disciplined team and defensively made some big plays when they needed them. "

Brewster QB Massimo Parrello threw for 298 yards, hitting on 15-22 passes for three TD's. Harrison's kicking game was a weapon as they kicked five of six kickoffs into the end zone and also kicked a field goal.

Harrison also took advantage of big play, scoring on a pick six and a kickoff return.

LAKELAND (2-1) took one on the chin, 40-0, vs. undefeated Clarkstown South.

CLASS AA

Yonkers Force didn't make it easy on reigning NYS Class A A Champion CARMEL, who broke the game open in the second half of a 32-6 road win Saturday at Roosevelt High School. Carmel sophomore RB Tristan Werlau rushed 13 times for 129 yards and a score while QB Matt Gay hit on 4 of 6 passes for 63 yards, including a scoring strike to Chris Nerys. Ram RB/DB Nick Rosaforte had a terrici two-way game, rushing for a score and led the defense

with eight tackles and two sacks.

The bad news for Carmel's foes, including Week 3 opponent RCK, is that the Rams (2-0), who have won 18 straight games, are getting closer to getting back both Matt Risley and Thomas Keating, a pair of skillful, two-way players, who have been injured.

CLASS B/C/D

BYRAM HILLS improved to 3-0 after a 35-14 thumping of Pearl River. Bobcat QB Jon Accurso fired two TD passes and rushed for another. Bobcat RB Gavin Javorsky added two rushing touchdowns for the Bobcats (3-0), who reeled off scores on the first five possessions of the game.

VALHALLA laid it on CROTON-HARMON, 42-7, when RB/WR Basiaka Butcher took six totes for 120 yards and two touchdowns and went airborne for three catches, 40 yards and a TD. Devan Cooper added five catches for 80 yards and a touchdown and Brendan O'Neill threw for 150 yards and a score and rushed for 60 yards and a touchdown for the Vikings (2-0).


