

Westlake Crushes the Falcons in the Class B Quarterfinals

While the Westlake and Albertus Magnus football teams may have met in a Section One Class B playoff game this past Saturday, the Wildcats proved that the Falcons weren't really in the same class, dominating them in a 48-20 rout.

"We needed to come out and play our brand of football, and I am happy that we did that," said Wildcat head coach John Castellano. "We did the things today that we had worked on all week and I am proud of that."

Among those things that Castellano referenced was running the football and the Wildcats had great success in that department. On the first play from scrimmage, with the ball at the Wildcats' 30-yard line, fullback Andrew DeBiase took off for a 42-yard carry, setting up Westlake deep inside Falcon territory. Three plays later,he capped off the drive with a 14-yard touchdown run. A two-point conversion gave the Wildcats an 8-0 lead with only a minute gone since the opening kickoff.

But the Westlake offense wouldn't get to rest for long because on the following kickoff the Wildcats' squib kick was misplayed by Magnus and Andrew Llamas recovered the ball at the Falcon 30-yard line. With great field position, the Wildcats looked to capitalize and it didn't take them long to do it. Halfback Nicholas Martinez ran the ball down near the goal line, setting up DeBiase for his second score and enabling the Wildcats to stretch their lead to 15-0 not even three minutes into the game.

Needing to keep the game competitive, Albertus Magnus looked to Lavonno Mitchell and he returned the ball all the way to midfield on the ensuing kickoff. But on fourth down and long, the Falcons

decided to go for it at midfield and quarterback Michael McGrath's long pass down the field fell incomplete with no receiver in sight.

On the following Wildcat possession, junior quarterback Jason Ausiello wanted to get it on the action. On the first play, he connected on a 30-yard pass play to tight end Dylan Ahern. Halfback Thomas Iazzetta wound up scoring just two plays later and the fourth-seeded Wildcats suddenly had a 22-0 cushion over the fifth-seeded Falcons.

With the ball, the Falcons turned to Mitchell for a spark. But on fourth down, again at midfield, the Falcons chose to go for it and once more failed to convert.

"We were prepared, we knew that they were underdogs going into this game and that they were going to take every chance that they could to put up points," Castellano said. "They don't want to give us the ball and I don't blame them. So our kids had to be prepared for that and they were."

Running back Eric Nieves would quickly make the Falcons pay for the

good starting field position, taking a handoff from Ausiello and bolting into the secondary on his way to a 43-yard carry to the end zone that gave Westlake a 28-0 lead. The Falcons did manage to score before halftime, cutting their deficit at the break to 28-6.

In the third quarter, the Wildcats knew that their main objective was to run the ball time and time again, and they certainly had no problem doing that. Thanks to the hefty running lanes caused by the Wildcat offensive line, backs Martinez, Nieves, and Nicholas Veltri all alternated big run after big run on the Wildcats' second possession of the quarter. Nieves put the finishing touches on the drive with his second touchdown, giving the Wildcats a 35-6 advantage.

"What goes underrated for us is our offensive line," Castellano said. "They work hard and they have a great concept of what we are trying to do schematically."

The Wildcats hope they can duplicate their winning formula next week, but it certainly will be much more difficult. They now advance to play top-seeded and unbeaten Ardsley next Saturday afternoon in a rematch of a September game that the Panthers came from behind in the second half to win 35-21.

Pleasantville Overcomes Injuries to Defeat the Broncos

Peasantville's Danny Melillo lay on the turf in pain after being tackled on the opening kickoff of the Section 1 Class B quarterfinal game against Bronxville Friday night while the stunned crowd at Parkway Field stood quiet and his teammates looked on hopefully.

Melillo, a key player and senior captain for the defending state champion Panthers, suffered a broken bone in his lower leg and returned from an emergency room visit to support his teammates from the bench as they used his injury as inspiration in a 43-20 victory over the Broncos.

"We lost one of our best players, a team captain and a leader, so it's next man up and play harder," senior two-way lineman Michael Matica said. "It's like a family member needs us. We are a family. We had to show that we could go on and win for our guys."

The No. 2 seed Panthers (6-2), who lost another key player, Harrison Hailsworth, to a torn Achilles tendon injury in last week's regular-season finale against Westlake, drew inspiration from their sideline wounded. Led by quarterback Jack Howe, receiver Jared Willens, running back Jaden Kamer and an aggressive defense, the rest of the "family" moved on to next Friday night's semifinal round and will host Putnam Valley.

Kamer rushed 20 times for 108 yards and three touchdowns, mostly in the second half when he had a spurt of six carries for 40 yards and a touchdown that increased the Panthers' lead to 29-6. Howe rushed for 53 yards, including an 18-yard touchdown, kicked a 35-yard field goal and also completed 7 of 15 passes for 102 yards. Willens caught several key passes, as did wideout Justin Perlman, to lead the offense in opening up a 23-6 halftime lead.

"I trusted my offensive line and just

got in behind the blocking, ran as hard as 'hell' and gave it all I could," Kamer said. "These guys (Nolan Egan, Matica, Willie Cahill, Willens), all of them, were fired up and stopped them. We have to get better now, with the injuries we have."

Kamer scored the first touchdown of the game with five minutes left in the first quarter to cap a 10-play drive that started from the 50-yard line. Howe's nine-yard dash on a fourth-down-and-seven play kept the drive alive and Kamer blasted in from the 4-yard line for the score.

"I was just going forward all the time," Kamer said. "I saw great blocks in front of me."

Willens's 65-yard punt return for a touchdown gave the Panthers a 14-0 lead in the first quarter. The senior bobbled the punt, picked the ball up off the ground, then turned to the left sideline and raced past Bronco tacklers to score.

Matica, Patrick Doherty, Cardel Robinson and Nolan Egan were among those leading the defense that held the Broncos to six points until late in the third quarter. The game was slowed down by several personal fouls and unsportsmanlike penalties as both teams pushed, shoved and grabbed after the whistle

"It was a little rough," Egan said. "It's the playoffs. We had guys hurt and they were playing hard on every play too. I don't think anyone was trying to hurt anyone. We just didn't want to give up anything. It's emotional."

Danny Minerva scored from 10 yards out to complete the scoring for Pleasantville with 6:13 remaining in the game.

The Panthers will have to overcome their injuries as they prepare for a meeting with a Putnam Valley team that surprised third-seeded Nanuet in the quarterfinals.














